

Westmount School is a Kindergarten to Grade 6 school with a student population of approximately 400. We offer flexible kindergarten programming, including full-time and regular kindergarten options, allowing families to choose the program that best meets their needs. From Grades 1 to 6, we provide 2 to 3 classes per grade, ensuring a supportive and engaging learning environment for all students. Our school is proud to offer Music and Physical Education programs taught by specialist teachers, enriching the educational experience for our students. We also provide dynamic extracurricular activities, including volleyball, basketball, and cross-country, fostering teamwork, skill development, and school spirit. In addition to our diverse academic programming, we offer Hockey, Ringette, and Multisport programs for interested Grade 4 to 6 students, providing unique opportunities for physical activity, personal growth, and collaboration. Our Strive Program delivers individualized programming designed to meet diverse academic, social, and behavioral needs, ensuring all learners have the support they need to succeed.





- Raises funds to support Westmount initiatives





Our staff, students, families and the community work together to support students in being passionate learners within our school, local community and beyond. We regularly celebrate our learning and successes at school and on our social media platforms.







### **STRATEGIES**

- Connect teachers and support staff with professional development opportunities to ensure best practices in implementing programs and strategies that support student learning and well-being.
- Provide collaborative PLC time with grade-level teaching partners to design lessons and assessments that promote critical thinking and deeper student understanding.
- Offer students diverse ways to demonstrate their learning and 'show what they know'.
- Provide access to digital tools such as speech-to-text and reader features through Read & Write for Google to support individual student needs.
- Participate in division-wide focus groups focused on specific topics or subject areas to share insights and enhance teaching practices.
- Ensure the assessment of student learning is both appropriate and effective, reflecting individual progress and areas for growth.
- Access support from Instructional Coaches to implement differentiated strategies and integrate assistive technology, ensuring all students succeed in the classroom.
- Collaborate with experts to design targeted learning opportunities that address challenges identified through Provincial Achievement Test results.
- Develop Support Plans (Individual Program Plans, Individual Support Plans, Behaviour Management Plans, and Medical Management Plans) tailored to individual student needs, emphasizing differentiation and effective accommodations, with input from families.
- Ensure all students have access to technology (Chromebooks, iPads, and ViewSonic Boards) to support meaningful, engaging learning experiences and boost achievement.
- Create intentional connections to monthly virtues to instill attitudes and behaviours that contribute to future success in the workplace.

Additionally, Westmount School partners with Golden Hills School Division to provide rich cultural opportunities, such as an annual powwow, a princess and warrior pageant, and the chief and council inauguration. 
### **STRATEGIES**

- For the 2024-2025 school year, we continue to have a full-time Siksika liaison who works with students academically and culturally. This role is designed to provide our First Nations, Métis, and Inuit students with ongoing support, positive relationships, and strong, meaningful connections to their culture.
- Our Siksika liaison presents to each class monthly on a cultural topic. These
  presentations are often tied to school-wide events such as Orange Shirt Day,
  Indigenous Peoples Day, Ribbon Skirt & Shirt Day, Rock Your Mocs, and Chief
  & Council elections, among others.
- Westmount School strives to be inclusive in all that we do. All students participate in activities that celebrate and promote Blackfoot culture.
- Pookaiks 'Children' Club provides students with an additional opportunity to explore Blackfoot culture. This club meets at recess and allows students to further delve into cultural traditions and teachings.
- Miss Westmount School and Westmount's Warrior proudly represent Westmount School at powwows and other cultural events throughout the year.
- Westmount School's Chief & Council plays an active school leadership role alongside our Grade 6 Student Government.
- Blackfoot words of the day are shared during morning announcements to foster cultural awareness and appreciation school-wide.


### **STRATEGIES**

- Our Strive program is designed to meet the diverse needs of our learners while promoting inclusivity. Students work toward individualized goals through independent work, small group activities, and classroom integration. Inclusion remains the ultimate goal for all students.
- Our Resource Team meets weekly to identify opportunities and provide the supports needed to help students reach their full potential. This approach is highly collaborative, drawing on the expertise and strengths of all staff and school partners.
- Westmount students benefit from a variety of targeted learning supports, including Emerging Readers, Early Literacy and Numeracy programs, and the Family School Community Resource Program.
- Research-based Fountas & Pinnell literacy kits are utilized for accurate assessment and to inform instruction.
- In-class small group and individualized reading instruction ensures students receive personalized support to enhance their literacy skills.
- Westmount School provides a well-maintained library with a school-based librarian to ensure a literacy-rich school environment.






## PROMOTE WELL-BEING THROUGH POSITIVE RELATIONSHIPS AND SKILL BUILDING
